SWIMMING MERIT BADGE

Swimming Merit Badge will be held on the following nights. Wednesday, March 10th, Wednesday, March 31st, Thursday, April 8th & Wednesday, April 14th

Requirements: You must have passed the 2nd & 1st Class swimming requirements, This can be done on the first night you attend, then you can start Swimming Merit Badge.

You need to have the Swimming Merit Badge Booklet and have read it.

LIFESAVING MERIT BADGE

Lifesaving Merit Badge will be held on all nights as well. Thursday, Feb. 25^{th} , Wednesday, Mar. 10^{th} , Wednesday, Mar. 31^{st} , Thursday, April 8^{th} & Wednesday, April 14^{th}

Requirements: You must have Swimming Merit Badge.

You need to attend all 5 sessions.

You need to have the Lifesaving Merit Badge Booklet & read it.

The Following are the Requirements for 2nd & 1st Class.

2nd Class

- 8a. Tell what precautions must be taken for a safe swim. (8 points of Safe Swim Defense see handbook)
- 8b. Demonstrate your ability to jump feet-first into water over your head in depth, level off and swim 25 feet on the surface, stop turn sharply, resume swimming, then return to your starting place.
- 8c. Demonstrate water rescue methods by reaching with a suitable object, and by throwing lines and objects. Explain why swimming rescues should not be attempted when a reaching or throwing rescue is possible, and explain why and how a rescue swimmer should avoid contact with the victim.

1st Class

- 9a. Tell what precautions must be taken for a safe trip afloat. (Safety Afloat)
- 9b. Successfully complete the BSA swimmer test. (Jump feet-first into water over the head in depth, level off, and begin swimming. Swim 75 yards in a strong manner using one or more of the following strokes: sidestroke, breaststroke, trudgen, or crawl; then swim 25 yards using an easy, resting backstroke. The 100 yards must be completed in one swim without stops and must include at least one sharp turn. After completing the swim, rest by floating.
- 9d. With a helper and a practice victim, show a line rescue both as tender and as rescuer. (The practice victim should be approximately 30 feet from shore in deep water.)
